WHEN AN EARTHQUAKE strikes, it's important that you and your family have an emergency plan in place. That includes creating contact cards for you and your children. The American Red Cross recommends preparing a contact sheet for your child to keep while at school.

EASY AS 1-2-3

1. Fill out these contact cards with information on whom to call and what to do in the event of an emergency. As you can see, the one on the left is for adults, and the one on the right is for children.
2. Print out multiple copies. You'll want to keep these at home, by the phone and in your wallet. Your child can keep it in his or her backpack.
